


KNIGHTS COLLECTING FLAGS FOR RETIREMENT

Please delete and block any email or phone number requesting these items. This is a popular scam that unfortunately is targeting members of our Parish and parishes around the country. You can always call the parish office to verify any request.

One of the most common scam methods is to send an email that will show up as from Fr. Bedel. The message will address the parishioner by name and say "I'm too busy" to get some needed gift cards. Clicking on the email address attached to Fr. Bedel's name quickly reveals it's an obvious scam.

On Being Saints: A Vision Statement Reflection

As I gathered my thoughts on our parish family vision statement, I remembered that vision sees the goal, and mission describes how to get to the goal. I also remembered how difficult it can be to write a vision statement that doesn't slide into being a mission statement. Aspiring, cooperating, forming—these action words suggest a mission statement, how we reach the goal, but the goal itself is clear enough: to be saints.

Distinguishing between vision and mission is easy when dealing with an inanimate object. Michelangelo envisions in a block of marble his goal—a figure of Moses. How he gets there is to apply hammer and chisel until the figure he envisioned stands before him—a marble Moses.

When it comes to a living thing, distinguishing vision and mission is trickier because a living thing is not so much a finished object as a process of growing, changing, and becoming. When is a live human being finished? When does he reach his goal? What is the goal? Simply to be alive?

A human is created in the image of God, so we have the potential to become like God, to share divine life. But how can a finite creature envision a goal that is infinite? Our vision is partial and fuzzy. However, God has provided a vision of a human living like God, full of divine life—Jesus Christ.

To become a saint means to actualize the image of God already within us, and we can watch that image in action by watching Jesus. He is the vision statement God has given us. Our mission is to live like him. So our vision and our mission are intertwined. Living like Christ is the way to become a saint, but if we live like Christ we are already saints.

Jesus talked about this intertwining of vision and mission, of becoming what we already are by acting like it. "Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, so that you may be children of your Father in heaven; for he makes his sun rise on the evil and the good, and sends rain on the just and the unjust." (Mt. 5:44-45)

Of course while we live in this finite world we children of God are still growing, changing, and becoming, so a saint in this world isn't yet complete. But if we persevere, continue to cooperate with God's grace, we will one day be brought to completion. How to persevere in our own time and place, and help each other persevere, is for a mission statement to describe.





LITURGICAL COLORS



Have you ever wondered why the colors in our church change throughout the year? Each color symbolizes a liturgical season or a particular day in our church calendar. The colors also represent particular qualities. This Sunday, the fifty-day Easter season will conclude with Pentecost, the birthday of the Church. Our colors will be red to symbolize the flames of the Holy Spirit. After Pentecost Sunday, we will begin the second round of Ordinary (as in ordered or numbered) Time, which is green this will start on June 4. We have some very important Solemnities on Sunday, May 26 the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, and Sunday, June 2 the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi), which require white, not green as the liturgical color. After that, you will begin to see the green on Sundays. Are you still asking why white or why green? Green symbolizes the hope we have with faith. White symbolizes Christ, purity, victory over death and joy among other things, and therefore, used for our most holy solemnities and seasons. Stay tuned for more color explanations late this fall when we look toward Advent.




