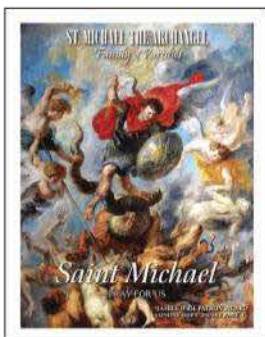

Beloved in Christ,

Please plan to bring the family to our first ever Family-wide picnic for the St. Michael the Archangel Family of Parishes 1:30 p.m. today (Sunday) at Sacred Heart. I look forward to seeing you there!

Please keep me and 40 other pilgrims in your prayers. We leave for our pilgrimage to Italy tomorrow (Sept. 30). I plan to send pictures to Jason Schaap to post on Facebook daily if possible. I am especially looking forward to being in Assisi on October 4, the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi. Lord willing, I will share the experience live via the local morning show here on [Sacred Heart Radio](#).

Also on October 4, the Serra Club will gather 5-6 p.m. for prayer during exposition of the Blessed Sacrament at St. Brigid. All are invited to pray for vocations to the priesthood and religious life. Find out more at: cincyserravocations.org

October is dedicated to the Rosary, which I like to call "The Gospel on a String" because we meditate on the Gospel as we pray it. We get to know Jesus better. How will your family solidify practice in this time-tested devotion? Don't be overwhelmed. Begin with one decade and increase from there. Make a plan today.

Because of the sheer numbers and the innocence of victims, abortion is arguably the worst thing happening in the United States right now. Since I will be out of the country, please take my place at the Ohio March for Life on October 4. Go to marchforlife.org/ohio/ for all the information. October is also Respect Life Month, with the first Sunday of October (next weekend) designated as Respect Life Sunday. Life Chains, which are essentially silent prayer vigils for the end of abortion, are happening in communities all over the country. Here locally, a chain is scheduled at the Greene County Courthouse in Xenia from 2-3 p.m. See the next page for more information.

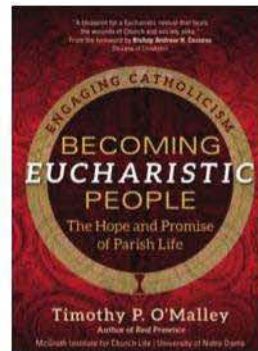
