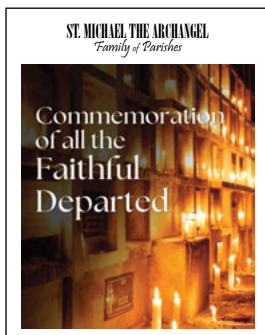

Beloved in Christ,

This coming Tuesday, November 5, is election day. Voting is a moral act because it can have moral effects for yourself and others. We have the opportunity to bring the Gospel of Jesus Christ into the public square, to promote good and limit evil with our vote.

Moreover, we vote with a well-formed conscience that is informed by the moral teachings of the Church as revealed by Jesus Christ directly through Sacred Tradition and Sacred Scripture, and indirectly through natural law reasoning. Proportionality is key, as not all issues have the same weight.

For example, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops have called abortion the pre-eminent issue because of the innocence of the victims and the high frequency to which it happens. 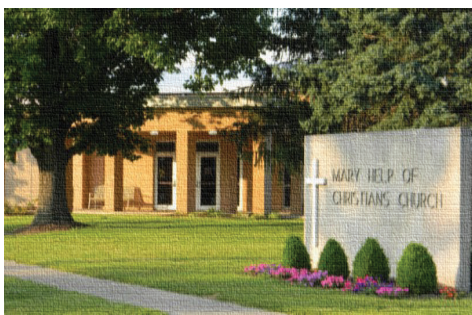

St. Charles Borromeo—Pray for Us

Charles Borromeo was the Archbishop of Milan from 1564 to 1584 and a cardinal of the Church. He was a leading figure of the Counter-Reformation combat against the Protestant Reformation together with Ignatius of Loyola and Philip Neri. He was responsible for significant reforms in the Church, including the founding of seminaries for education of priests.

The Church that he had worked so hard to make more human recognized him as a saint in 1610 and his feast day is celebrated on November 4.

Known as the loving reformer, Charles Borromeo cared about people and wanted them to know that the Church of God cared about them. He devoted his entire life to helping the people of God become more like Jesus.

Even now, he says that as Catholics each of us can make a difference in the Body of Christ. We can reach out to help those around us and make the face of God more real in the world.
