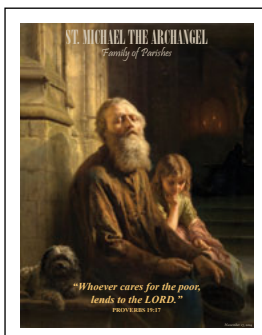

THIRTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Beloved in Christ,

As a family of parishes, our annual October count for attendance at our 11 weekend Masses averaged 2,684 people this year. This is *up five percent* from October of 2023. This statistic segways nicely into the next two topics:

We all know Catholics who are starving spiritually, having fallen away from the sacraments. Here in the Archdiocese of Cincinnati, we are observing next Sunday, November 24, as "Together Sunday." The idea is that we pray about which friend or family member in this situation we will invite to join us back at Mass on November 24 to celebrate Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. Tell a buddy, bring a friend.

As I mentioned above, we have 11 Masses of precept at six parishes every weekend to accommodate 2,684 people encountering the Living God in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary falls on December 9 in three weeks.

Since the Second Sunday of Advent on December 8 outranks the Immaculate Conception, any Masses on Sunday evening would be for the Sunday obligation, not Immaculate Conception. Therefore, we will not have any vigil Masses, only our usual slate of eight Masses on Monday (four in the morning and four in the evening, see page 11 for details).

Since the obligation is the same as a Sunday, these eight Masses will accommodate our average of 2,684 people who will encounter the Living God on this holy day of opportunity. Please make a plan now to bring the family on Monday, December 9.

Thanks for your prayers. Be assured of my daily prayers for you.

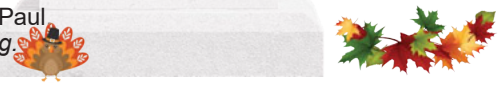

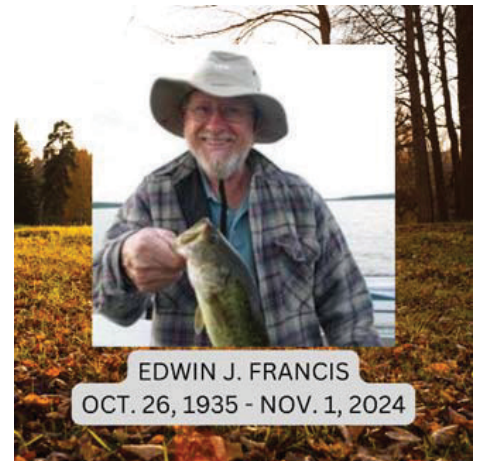

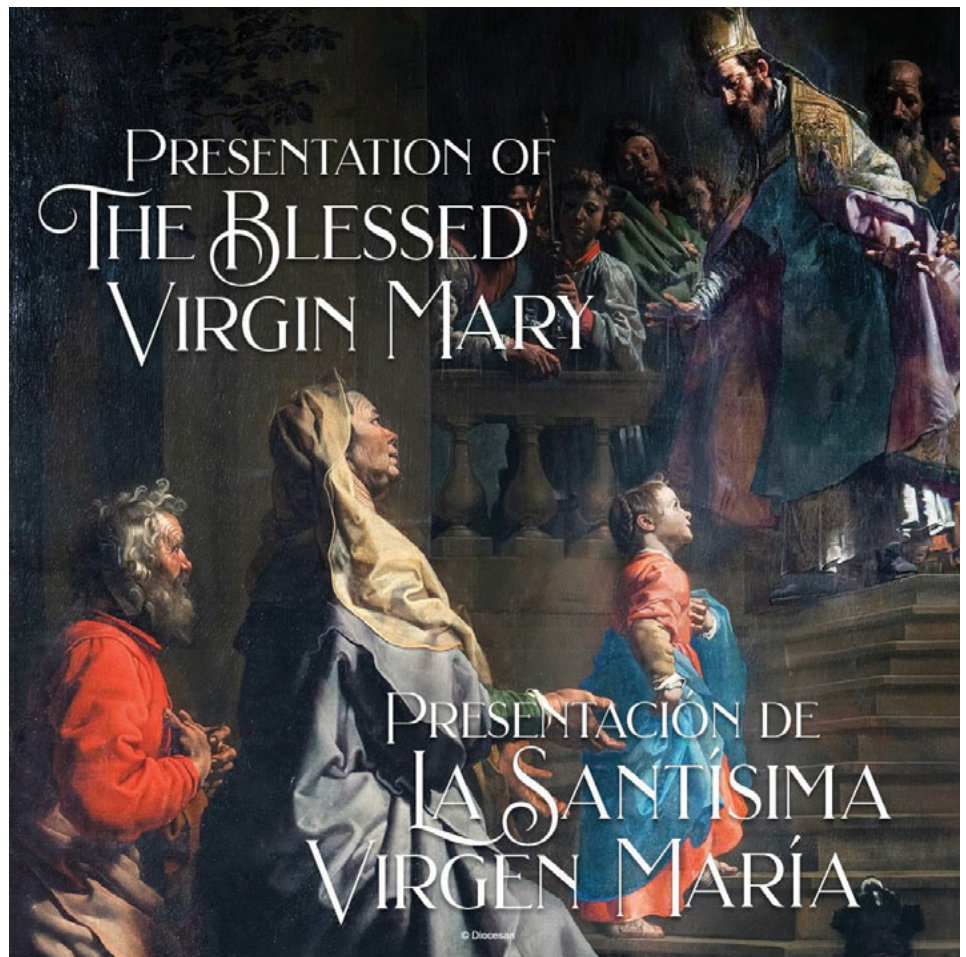
