

Beloved in Christ,

We will offer our regular four Masses on Thanksgiving this Thursday. Not only is the Eucharist the perfect way to begin such a day, it's also the perfect prayer of thanksgiving. See the previous page for those regular Mass times.

Next Sunday begins a new liturgical year and the season of Advent. So, before it all begins, I provide the following for preparation:

The world outside will try to convince us it's Christmas, but it's really Advent December 1 – 24, beginning with vigil Masses on November 30. The challenge for the Christian is to observe Advent during Advent and Christmas during Christmas. Advent is a penitential season of expectation and preparation. Christmas is the season of celebrating the birth of Jesus December 25 – January 12, which is 19 days this year, 79 percent the length of Advent.

How do we resist the cultural pressure of jumping right into Christmas? The Advent wreath in a prominent place in the home provides a teaching moment for every member of the family as an additional candle is lit each week. The Jesse tree can go a long way until it is appropriate to put up a Christmas tree. An internet search will provide dozens of ideas for ornaments that teach salvation history leading up to the time of Jesus.

Speaking of Christmas trees, when is the best time for them? My research shows that Christmas Eve has the longest historical connection. Plus, this prominent decoration coincides with the season it celebrates. But if that raises too many eyebrows, Advent provides the "Advent shift" as another option.

From December 1 to December 16, the focus of Advent will be the second coming of Jesus at the end of the world and how we prepare to meet Him. However, December 17 – 24 focuses on the anticipation of Jesus 2,000 years ago and the events that led up to His coming the first time. Thus, December 17 is packed with meaning as the day of the shift (more good information about this is at aleteia.org/2018/12/05/the-real-meaning-and-origin-of-the-christmas-tree).

Advent is also a great time to build a crèche (nativity scene). However, an appropriate teaching moment is to keep the Baby Jesus out of the manger until Christmas.

In the parish offices, we are setting the trend: Christmas parties during Christmas, not Advent. The 19-day Christmas season provides three weekends, and many people have time off work, but more on that in the coming weeks.

Thanks for your prayers. Be assured of my daily prayers for you.

The Origins of Christ the King

In an effort to promote peace in the aftermath of World War I, Pope Pius XI determined there would be a new Mass added to the Sunday liturgy—the Mass of Christ the King. The first Mass was celebrated October 31, 1925.

That particular year was significant because of political uprisings on three major fronts. The first was led by Benito Mussolini, the fascist dictator in Rome. The second was Adolf Hitler's rise to power, who soon would become the dictator of Germany. His third concern was Joseph Stalin, who was about to assume the role of Premier of the Russian communists.

The politically astute Pope Pius XI recognized these developing dangers, and he quickly brought the weight of the Catholic Church against the three dictators.

He ordered the Mass of Christ the King to be established, proclaimed and preached all over the world. Later, he would write other encyclicals against the dictators and condemn their ruthlessness.

The tremendous emphasis placed upon the biblical teachings of Christ the King was the centerpiece of the Church's resistance to the fascists, the Nazi party and the communists. Pope Pius XI told those dictators and those "petty kings" that there is only one king of the world—Jesus Christ.

This year on Sunday, November 24, we will gather again to celebrate the 99th anniversary Mass of Christ the King, and our religious liturgy will continue to profess that we believe in the sacred value of truth. With Jesus as our King, we will continue to hope and pray the Lord's Prayer: "Thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven."

Our earthly kingdoms are material and temporary, but the kingdom of God is spiritual and universal—founded on Truth and sustained by Love.

The dictators of the past have died, and our current political climate will also pass. So, at present and in the future, may we pledge allegiance to Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe.






